This is a journey through Colombia for those who identify as travelers, not tourists.



You'll enjoy not having WiFi for days, bathing in jungle rivers, and dancing to ancestral dances and songs.

And best of all, you'll be supporting dozens of families who, through sustainable and small-scale tourism, complement their income from farming, agriculture, and fishing while valuing and sharing their natural and cultural heritage.

Detailed itinerary

Day 1:Bogotá

Transfer in from Bogotá airport to selected hotel with guide.

Hotel BH Bicentenario - Standard Room: Lodging at BH Bicentenario hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Included: transfer in with guide, lodging, breakfast

Day 2:Bogotá

Tropical Fruit Safari: Exploring Paloquemao Market in Bogotá: This tour is the best aperitif to fall in love with Colombia, to discover the flavor of its culture and all that it has to offer.

Thanks to its geographical location, in Colombia it is possible to find a great variety of fruits of all colors, sizes and flavors (if you don't believe us, you can check it in the fruit dictionary that we will give you at the beginning of the tour). In addition to knowing the secrets and history of this market, passing through the colorful "plaza de las flores" and the craft stalls, you can try fifteen different fruits, three shots of fresh juices and two typically Colombian snacks.



During the tour you will not only taste fruits, this is an experience that leads you to have a real contact with the history of this wonderful country through the senses, the kindness of its people and the joy that characterizes them

The duration of the tour is approximately 2-3 hours and we recommend taking this tour as your breakfast of the day.

Bogotá's essential city tour: On this half-day tour we will visit Bogotá's historical center at La Candelaria neighborhood, passing through its main sights. We will visit the Plaza de Bolívar, where the headquarters of national and local government are located, also the Congress and the Justice Hall as well as the city's Catedral Primada. The tour continues walking this colonial area until reaching the Gold Museum, which has an impressive collection of pre-Columbian goldsmiths from Colombia's native communities. We will finish at the Museo de Botero, an interesting art collection that was donated to the city by the renowned Colombian painter Fernando Botero.

Gold Museum is closed on Mondays and Botero Museum on Tuesdays.

VIP Visit to Monserrate Sanctuary: Included a visit to the Monserrate Sanctuary. Located at 3.150 m.a.s.l., this sanctuary is accessible by cable car or funicular and apart from being a very famous pilgrimage site in Colombia, it offers a spectacular panoramic view of the city.

The VIP pass allows faster access to the cable car/funicular and saves time when there are crowds of visitors.

Day 3:Bogotá

Visit to Chingaza National Park

The Chingaza National Natural Park is a protected area located only a couple of hours away from Bogotá, where it is possible to be in one of the best preserved and most beautiful *páramos* in Colombia. These unique tropical ecosystems are water factories and reservoirs, inhabited by several species of plants and animals such as *frailejones* or spectacled bears.

The excursion starts early in the morning heading towards the northeastern part of the city, in a route where after about 1 hour you can glimpse the rural landscape of the Sabana de Bogotá and the Eastern Andes. The hike begins from the Park's entrance through the municipality of Guasca at 3,200 m.a.s.l., and will take about 4 hours walking approximately 12 kilometers through the forest and ascending to 3,700 m.a.s.l.

We will pass through the Lagunas de Siecha, where the Muiscas performed offering ceremonies such as those described in the El Dorado Legend, and where in fact several gold pieces were found and extracted after several drainages. During the tour you can admire *frailejones*, deer, several species of birds and with some luck, even spectacled bears.

In the afternoon, return to Bogotá.

Day 4:Bogotá - Puerto Carreño - Tuparro NP

Transfer out from selected hotel to Bogotá airport

Domestic flight: Domestic flight from Bogotá to Puerto Carreño.

Expedition El Tuparro National Park and Cerros de Mavecure

6 days - 5 nights

We will visit the Mavecure Hills and El Tuparro National Park, navigating the waters of the Orinoco River on the border between Colombia and Venezuela.

The geography here is impressive and is marked by the rocks of the Guiana Shield, some of the oldest on Earth, the Andean, savannah and jungle rivers, and the vast regions of the Orinoco and Amazon.

We will travel to the pristine Colombian East, interacting with different indigenous ethnic groups, camping on the river banks and witnessing the magical meeting of the plains and the jungle.

This is undoubtedly one of the most authentic and spectacular adventures you can experience in Colombia.

Below is an estimated itinerary of activities to do on the route. However, it is possible that there may be some changes depending on weather conditions or your arrival/departure time, as there is only one airline with a daily flight serving these destinations. Also, the programme can be adapted according to your interests and your energy when doing the activities. There are days when you can do more than one activity, so feel free to ask our guide about the possibilities and together you can agree on the best way to enjoy the destination.

Day 1: Puerto Carreño - Casuarito - Caño Mesetas - Maipure

Our guide will meet you at the airport in Puerto Carreño. Your expedition starts by sailing the Orinoco River to Casuarito where we will have lunch. There we will take a vehicle to the petroglyphs, where you can observe pictograms more than 4,500 years old.

We will continue to the mouths of Caño Mesetas for about an hour, passing then to El Tablón, where a vehicle will be waiting to take us to the Tuparro River. We will then head to the Maipures rapids, one of the most representative sites of this excursion and which was listed by Humboldt as the eighth wonder of the world.

You will have time to swim in the Tuparro River before returning to the camp for lunch.

Dinner and overnight.

Included: transfer out, domestic flight, lunch, lodging, dinner, excursion, local guide, waterway and land transport

Day 5:Tuparro NP

Day 2: Raudalito Caño Lapa - Cerro del Guahibo

After breakfast, we will start the day by visiting the Sikuani community of Raudalito Caño Lapa. Here a beautiful jungle trail between waterfalls awaits us. Here you will have the opportunity to see the process of preparing cassava for meals and admire the traditional churuata houses built with wood and palm.

You will have time to swim in the Tuparro River before returning to the camp for lunch.

In the afternoon we will hike the Cerro del Guahibo to watch the sunset before returning to the camp.

Dinner and overnight.

Included: lunch, lodging, dinner, breakfast, excursion, local guide, waterway and land transport

Day 6:Tuparro NP - Comunidad Remanso

Day 3: Tuparro NP - Estrella fluvial: Orinoco · Guaviare · Atabapo - Inírida - Mavecure

After breakfast, we will sail the Orinoco River, passing through several communities and the Mirador de la Virgen, in Castillito. We will continue to the Estrella Fluvial del Sur, where the Orinoco, Guaviare and Atabapo rivers meet. We will continue along the Guaviare until we reach the Inírida River and the town of the same name.

We will rest and have lunch there and then leave for the community of El Remanso of the Puinave ethnic group, in the vicinity of the Mavecure Hills.

Included: lunch, lodging, dinner, breakfast, excursion, local guide, waterway and land transport

Day 7:Comunidad Remanso - Cerros de Mavecure - Comunidad Remanso

Day 4: Mavecure - Caño San Joaquín - Comunidad Venado Curripaco - Flor de Inírida - Remanso

After an early morning coffee and fruit, it's time to start our hike the Mavecure Hills. We will make a short transfer by speedboat and start a short but challenging hike that ascends 100 meters in about 1 km. This is the Pajarito rock, the smallest of the three hills. At the top, you will be rewarded with a breathtaking view of the jungle and its winding rivers as far as the eye can see. Return to have breakfast and rest.



After lunch, we continue to a small lagoon at Caño San Joaquín which invites you to take a refreshing swim. We continue to Caño Bocón and Caño Caimán. Here we will share with the community of Venado of the Curripaco ethnic group. We will return after sunset to Caño Pajarito andyou will have there the opportunity to practice our fishing skills with the locals.

Dinner and overnight.

Included: lunch, lodging, dinner, breakfast, excursion, local guide, waterway and land transport

Day 8:Comunidad Remanso - Inírida

Day 5: Mavecure - Caño Matraca - Inírida

We will leave El Remanso for Inírida after breakfast and rest in El Remanso or walk along one of its trails.

Return to Inírida after lunch, stopping at the mouths of Caño Matraca to, with a bit of luck, spot pink dolphins.

Transfer to the hotel in Inírida, dinner and accommodation.

Day 9:Inírida - Bogotá

Day 6: Coco - Caño Vitina

After breakfast and if time permits, we will visit Caño Vitina and Los Cocos to see the ancient petroglyphs found there.

After lunch, you will have time to explore the city before heading to the airport for your return flight.

Domestic flight: Domestic flight from Inírida to Bogotá.

Transfer from Bogotá airport to selected hotel.

Day 10:Bogotá - Cabo de la Vela

Alta Guajira and Macuira National Park Excursion 4 days - 3 nights

Day 1

Uribía, Manaure Salt Flats and Cabo de La Vela:

Your trip starts in the morning in Riohacha, from where you will leave for the Manaure Salt Flats, one of the most famous places in La Guajira, where you will visit the ponds where salt is extracted by hand, accompanied by a guide from the community, it will be a 1 hour trip. We continue to Uribia, the indigenous capital of La Guajira, which will take about 20 minutes by car. We will depart for Cabo de La Vela, a 2 hour drive. Upon arrival, you will have lunch at the lodge. In the afternoon you will hike up to Pilon de Azucar, a sacred place of the Wayuu community.

You will have time to rest at Playa Dorada and Ojo de Agua, watch an incredible sunset and then go back to the ranchería.

You will have dinner and rest at the lodge.

Included: transfer out, domestic flight, lunch, lodging, dinner, excursion, local guide, private transportation

Day 11:Cabo de la Vela - Nazareth

Day 2

Bahia Honda and Nazareth:


After breakfast, around 07:00 am, we get into the vans and start a journey of about 5 hours across the arid desert to Nazareth, one of the most remote villages of La Guajira, which is also the gateway to the National Natural Park of La Macuira (an oasis in the middle of the desert).

Before arriving we will make a stop in Pusheo and visit a traditional trading house, where you will find handicrafts and other traditional items of the region and have lunch. Upon arrival in Nazareth, you will meet your local host, take a tour to the viewpoint of the virgin, receive a talk from National Parks and head to the lodge for activities with the community, dinner and accommodation.

Included: lunch, lodging, dinner, breakfast, local guide, private transportation







Serranía de La Macuira. Taroa Dunes and Punta Gallinas:

Early in the morning, you will hike to the Aliwalu dunes in the National Park of La Macuira, have lunch and then head to Puerto Estrella to visit the lagoon of the ducks and then arrive at the Taroa Dunes, a journey of about 3.5 hours. The Taroa Dunes are one of the most beautiful natural settings of La Guajira, as they are hills of sand that melts into the Caribbean Sea. Then you will visit the Punta Gallinas lighthouse, where you will hear local stories about this place, as well as enjoy the great scenery, as you are at the northernmost point of South America. You will go to see some viewpoints and head to the lodge to participate in a Wayúu weaving activity and then enjoy dinner and finally rest.

Day 13:Punta Gallinas - Tayrona National Park

Day 4

Mayapo Beaches:

Around 7:00 am you will leave the posada for the beaches of Mayapo, a journey of approximately 5 hours. Upon arrival, you will visit the Maliwala Refuge, a place to enjoy traditional cuisine. You will have a lunch that will bring together some of the most exquisite dishes of the Guajira gastronomy. You will have time to enjoy the beaches of Mayapo, one of the must-see destinations on your trip to La Guajira.

This area is ideal for water sports as there are good winds, good waves and sandy beaches. At mid-afternoon and after a journey of approx. 40 minutes, you will arrive at a hostel in Riohacha, where you can rest, take a shower and get ready to go to your next destination.

Included: lunch, lodging, breakfast, local guide, private transportation



Day 14:Palomino - Tayrona National Park

Full day visit to Palomino: Your trip will start early in the morning heading to Los Flamencos Flora and Fauna Sanctuary (SFF), which is 20 minutes from the city of Riohacha and 30 minutes from the village of Palomino. With the Tocoromana community, you will walk along the "Mainshirutshi" trail, learning about the medicinal use of local plants.

Find a charming and colourful sanctuary of flora and fauna. Here you can have fun watching and enjoying a variety of landscapes, where you can see pink flamingos, turtles, exotic birds, deer and many others. If you are lucky, you will be able to see sceneries where between 800 and 4000 birds can congregate from the sea, from the cayucos or over the shimmering lagoons.

We then continue with a tour of the Navío Quebrado Lagoon, for an interpretative sighting of flamingos and other birds that inhabit the SFF. You will share a traditional lunch with locals and have some time to relax on the beach.



In the afternoon you will share in the ranchería with the Tocoromana community before returning to your hotel.

Day 15:Tayrona National Park

Excursion to Tayrona National Park - Arrecifes and Cabo San Juan: Trail length 14 kilometers

Difficulty Level Medium

Departure from Santa Marta, 1 hour until arriving to Cañaveral, from where the 5 kilometers walk begins, towards the beaches, crossing through humid and dry forests, where you can appreciate the local flora and fauna, passing by the beaches of San Felipe, Gumarra, Arrecifes, Arenilla and the natural pool, then you arrive to the beautiful beaches of Cabo San Juan 2 kilometers) here you have restaurant services and bathrooms, in these beaches you can enjoy bathing in the sea.



Recommendations

Trail of medium difficulty, 80 or more relative humidity, 32 degrees average, bring insect repellent, sun block, towel, water, adequate walking shoes.

Day 16: Tayrona National Park - Cartagena

Transfer from Tayrona National Park to Cartagena. Approximate length: 5 hours. At the appointed time, our representative will meet you for the transfer from Tayrona National Park to Cartagena. The approximate length of this service point to point, is 5 hours.

Fishing & Cooking with the locals in La Boquilla: Every morning, 365 days a year, the people of the village La Boquilla, get up to go fishing.

La Boquilla is the home to many families with African origins whose principal source of income is fishing.

There are two big lagoons: the Cienaga de Juan Polo and the Cienaga de la Virgen. Different species of fish can be caught in these lagoons and the fishermen use their own traditional technique of fishing. They catch sea bass (ro´balo), shad (sa´balo), common two-banded sea bream (mojarra), ocean-bass (pargo negro), mullet (lebranche), as well as sea snails, clams, shrimp, crawfish and lobster. Three common techniques are generally used: fishing line, nets and traps.

The fishermen will wait for us in La Boquilla to take us to the lagoon in their canoes. The tour guide will help us communicate with the fishermen. For about 2-3 hours, we will fish in the lagoon (don't forget to bring a hat, sunscreen and mosquito repellent!). The fishermen will explain how to use the fishing line, how to throw



the fishing net and how to position the traps in order to catch shrimp and crawfish. You can keep your catch! If you would like to eat the fish and crabs you have caught, we can go to one of the fishermen's house to cook and have lunch together.

Drum Workshop in La Boquilla: La Boquilla is an afro descendant fishermen village that for more than 200 years until today they still continue in a heroic struggle of cultural resistance to preserve their ancestral traditions, where drums play a leading role.

Today we invite you to an exciting tour to observe and play these Afro Colombian wild drums in their habitat, for this reason: Play it even if you don 't play, dance even if you don 't dance, sing even if you don 't sing... Together We can!

Our Drum Workshop of about an hour duration, is a unique opportunity to connect yourself with the typical rhythms of Afro Colombian folk music such as Cumbia, Mapale´ and Champeta, through immersion by playing traditional drums.

The team of Batambora Drum Workshop School invites you to live an extraordinary experience; first a little theory, then the presentation and interaction: execution of Drums.

Batambora is a project led by a group of pushing young people from the Afro descendant community of La Boquilla, who are committed to human and economic development that is aimed at rescuing and preserving the cultural traditions of the African heritage.

We like to support young people who make a difference, we invite you to live it!

Day 17:Cartagena

Cartagena's City tour by bike: We offer a guided city tour by bicycle through the historical center (the walled city), Getsemani'a and Manga.

The tour starts in the historical center: We will ride by all the main attractions and landmarks and we will stop several times in order to take photos and listen to our guide's stories about Cartagena.

The tour goes on to Getsemani', the neighborhood where Florentino Ariza lived. He's the main character in the worldwide known novel *Love in the time of Cholera* that is written by Colombian Nobel Prize winner Gabriel Garci'a Ma'rquez.

Then, we will go across the Roman Bridge, towards Manga. We will pass the beautiful Villa Roman. We will then visit the cementery of Manga, the oldest cementery in Cartagena. We continue along the seafront to finish our tour in the city center.

Our guide will pick you up if your hotel is located i the Historic Center or Getsemaní.


