

Detailed itinerary

Day 1:Bogotá

Transfer in from Bogotá airport to selected hotel with guide

Hotel BH La Quinta - Standard Room: Lodging at BH La Quinta hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Included: transfer in with guide, lodging, breakfast

Day 2:Bogotá

Tropical Fruit Safari: Exploring Paloquemao Market in Bogotá: This tour is the best aperitif to fall in love with Colombia, to discover the flavor of its culture and all that it has to offer.

Thanks to its geographical location, in Colombia it is possible to find a great variety of fruits of all colors, sizes and flavors (if you don't believe us, you can check it in the fruit dictionary that we will give you at the beginning of the tour). In addition to knowing the secrets and history of this market, passing through the colorful "plaza de las flores" and the craft stalls, you can try fifteen different fruits, three shots of fresh juices and two typically Colombian snacks.



During the tour you will not only taste fruits, this is an experience that leads you to have a real contact with the history of this wonderful country through the senses, the kindness of its people and the joy that characterizes them.

The duration of the tour is approximately 2-3 hours and we recommend taking this tour as your breakfast of the day.

Bogotá's essential city tour: On this half-day tour we will visit Bogotá's historical center at La Candelaria neighborhood, passing through its main sights. We will visit the Plaza de Bolívar, where the headquarters of national and local government are located, also the Congress and the Justice Hall as well as the city's Catedral Primada. The tour continues walking this colonial area until reaching the Gold Museum, which has an impressive collection of pre-Columbian goldsmiths from Colombia's native communities. We will finish at the Museo de Botero, an interesting art collection that was donated to the city by the renowned Colombian painter Fernando Botero.

Gold Museum is closed on Mondays and Botero Museum on Tuesdays.

VIP Visit to Monserrate Sanctuary. Included a visit to the Monserrate Sanctuary. Located at 3.150 m.a.s.l., this sanctuary is accessible by cable car or funicular and apart from being a very famous pilgrimage site in Colombia, it offers a spectacular panoramic view of the city.

The VIP pass allows faster access to the cable car/funicular and saves time when there are crowds of visitors.

Hotel BH La Quinta - Standard Room: Lodging at BH La Quinta hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Included: excursion, bilingual guide, snack, local guide, entrance fees, lodging, breakfast

Day 3:Bogotá - Pitalito - San Agustín

Transfer out from selected hotel to Bogotá airport

Domestic flight: Domestic flight from Bogotá to Pitalito.

Ground transfer from Pitalito to San Agustín. Approximate length: 45 minutes.

Coffee tour at Finca La Cabaña: Coffee is an essential product for both the economy of San Agustín and for other towns in this region, where the best specialty coffees in Colombia are currently produced. On this tour, we will be able to visit an organic coffee farm where we can learn about the bean production process in a very authentic way, from the seed and sowing, until obtaining the final product. Our guide will be Luis Alejandro, owner of Finca La Cabaña, who proudly and humbly shows us the success of his work and that of his father, who began growing coffee here over more than 50 years ago. At the end of the tour, Luis will invite us to enjoy some of his fantastic specialty coffees with all our senses.




Hotel Akawanka - Standard Room: Lodging at Akawanka hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Day 4:San Agustín

Visit to the Archaeological Park of San Agustín: Today we'll get to know the famous San Agustín Archaeological Park located just 10 minutes by car from town where we can admire the legacy of a millenary civilization represented by iconic statues, as well as several tombs and monuments. We will visit the small Archaeological Museum, the Mesitas A, B, C and D, the Forest of the Statues, the spectacular Lavapatas Fountain and the Alto del Lavapatas.





Visit to the Magdalena Strait and Obando: We will visit the Magdalena Strait, the narrowest point that the main river of Colombia exhibits on its way to the ocean and which is surrounded by a beautiful natural landscape of Andean forest. Just a few kilometers from there we find the small town of Obando, where we will see some tombs similar to those of the Tierradentro Archaeological Park in Cauca, as well as a small museum in which pieces, older even than those found in San Agustín, are displayed. The most famous of them is perhaps the "Winged Fish" piece of goldwork, of which a replica is preserved in this museum, since the original was moved to the Gold Museum in Bogotá.

Hotel Akawanka - Standard Room: Lodging at Akawanka hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Alternative: Adventure in El Tablón, La Chaquira, La Pelota and El Purutal – Horseback riding

Today we can enjoy the most famous ride of San Agustín led by an expert local guide who will take us through a circuit that runs through four archaeological sites: we will cross the rural area of the town to arrive first at La Pelota, where we can see three statues located very close from where they were originally found, as well as vestiges of an original mound. A few meters from there is El Purutal, where there are four more statues of which two still retain the original coloration that is believed to have been characteristic to many other monoliths in the area.

Following this, we will continue to El Tablón, an archaeological site where five statues of approximately 2 meters classified as female are exhibited, and where there is a small ethnographic museum organized by the residents of El Tablón township. We will then go to La Chaquira, an archaeological site where there are different human and animal figures carved into volcanic stone that look towards the impressive Magdalena river canyon, one of the most spectacular views that can be seen in San Agustín. To get to El Tablón we will walk less than 15 minutes, while to get to La Chaquira we will descend a hill on foot in less than half an hour, although the ascent back takes about 1 hour.

Day 5:San Agustín - Popayán

Ground transfer from San Agustín to Popayán. Approximate length: 5 hours.

Gastronomic tour through the center of Popayán: Popayán is a city with an interesting gastronomic tradition as a consequence of both the geographical and social diversity, as well as the history of the Cauca department. Its Gastronomic Congress, that has been held since 2003 and brings together more than 30,000 visitors, as well as the declaration granted by UNESCO as a Creative City of Gastronomy (the first in the world, in addition), ratify this delicious facet of the White City.

We are invited to a tour through the streets of the historic center of the city where we will learn more about the gastronomic culture of the Payanese, its festival and the historic UNESCO declaration. Of course we will also try the famous pipián empanadas, hervidos, carantantas, aplanchados, Eduardo Santos (dessert with the name of a former president) and salpicones. Today it is best, if we only have a small lunch!

The tour begins and ends at the hotel in the historic center and is done on foot. If transportation service is required, this must be informed in advance.

Hotel La Plazuela - Standard Room: Lodging at La Plazuela hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Included: private transportation, excursion, bilingual guide, snack, lodging, breakfast

Day 6:Santa Marta - Tayrona National Park

Visit to the market in Silvia: We will visit the town of Silvia, located 1 hour and a half north of Popayán, where every Tuesday the Guambiano-Misak indigenous community that lives in the surrounding villages gathers to exchange their products, resulting in a colorful market. These are the children of the indigenous communities that originally inhabited this region and still preserve some of their ancestral heritages.

In the central square of the town we will meet our local host who will take us through the market, telling us a little bit about the customs and history of her community, but also about the interesting variety of colors, smells and flavors of the Andean products that are sold here.

Domestic flight: Domestic flight from Popayán to Santa Marta.

Transfer from Santa Marta to Tayrona National Park. Approximate length: 1 hour.

Hotel Villa Maria Tayrona - Standard Jungle View Room: Lodging at Villa Maria Tayrona hotel in Standard Jungle View room with breakfast included.

Included: excursion, local guide, private transportation, bilingual guide, domestic flight, lodging, breakfast

Day 7:Palomino - Tayrona National Park

Full day Tour Palomino: Your trip will start early in the morning heading to Los Flamencos Flora and Fauna Sanctuary (SFF), which is 20 minutes from the city of Riohacha and 30 minutes from the village of Palomino. With the Tocoromana community, you will walk along the "Mainshirutshi" trail, learning about the medicinal use of local plants.



Find a charming and colourful sanctuary of flora and fauna. Here you can have fun watching and enjoying a variety of landscapes, where you can see pink flamingos, turtles, exotic birds, deer and many others. If you are lucky, you will be able to see sceneries where between 800 and 4000 birds can congregate from the sea, from the cayucos or over the shimmering lagoons.

We then continue with a tour of the Navío Quebrado Lagoon, for an interpretative sighting of flamingos and other birds that inhabit the SFF. You will share a traditional lunch with locals and have some time to relax on the beach.

In the afternoon you will share in the ranchería with the Tocoromana community before returning to your hotel.

Day 9:Mompox

Walking Tour of Mompox: Uncovering the Charms of Colombia's Colonial Gem:

Are you ready to explore the historic and colonial beauty of Mompox? Join our exciting walking tour! We'll start with an introduction that will help you locate yourself geographically and immerse yourself in local history.

Then, we'll visit the sites of interest in ascending order, from the impressive Plaza de la Libertad to the majestic Basilica Minor of the Holy Christ, passing by the house of Candelario Obeso (the famous Black Poet), the Plaza de la Concepción, the Bolivar Stone, the House of the Angels, the House of Culture, the Portals of the Marquess, the church of Santa Barbara, the House of the Te Deum, the Plaza de Santo Domingo, and the National College Pinillos (formerly known as the University College of San Pedro Apóstol). And we can't forget the Municipal Cemetery, a place full of history and mysteries.

During the three-hour tour, we recommend wearing sunscreen, comfortable clothing, and tennis shoes to walk comfortably. Also, don't forget to bring a hat or cap to protect yourself from the sun and repellent to avoid insect bites.

Mompox Culinary Workshop: Discover the Flavors of the Colonial Era

Discover the culinary richness of Mompox with our interactive workshops! Immerse yourself in the mix of cultures that occurred during the colonial era and learn to make delicious dishes with ancestral preparation techniques that have been preserved to this day.



For three hours, we will teach you how to make authentic delicacies such as Queso de Capa, El Kasabe, Dulce de Limón, Almojábana, and Vino de Corozo. Get ready to delight in the flavors and knowledge of this unique region!

Don't forget to wear comfortable clothes and tennis shoes to fully enjoy the experience. We also recommend bringing sunscreen, a hat or cap, and mosquito repellent to protect yourself from the sun and mosquitoes.

La Gloria Hotel Mompox - Standard Room: Lodging at La Gloria hotel in Standard room with breakfast included.

Day 10:Mompox - San Basilio de Palenque - Cartagena

Transfer from Mompox to Cartagena. Approximate length: 6 hours.: At the appointed time, our representative will meet you for the transfer from Mompox to Cartagena. The approximate length of this service point to point, is 6 hours.

Tour to San Basilio de Palenque: A corner of Africa in America! Benkos Bioho, a runaway slave who, accompanied by 36 other male and female slaves, hid in the area found what is now known as San Basilio de Palenque, the first slavery- free town in Colombia. Their palenquera language and traditions and rituals remained intact since they had no connection with the main road and the city and remained isolated until the seventies when the famous boxer "Kid Pambele'" placed this settlement on the map and brought with him access roads to the village.



Located an hour and a half's drive from Cartagena by road, this African corner, declared by UNESCO as intangible cultural heritage of humanity, offers to visitors a window on Afro-descendant history in Colombia and America.

A guide and private vehicle will pick you up at your hotel and take you comfortably to San Basilio de Palenque, where a local guide will receive us and we will learn a little of the Palenquero dialect, history and culture of this great town. Through craft arts such as the work of the Spinners, who with their strong

movement prepare the corn to feed their families, and the beautiful art of weaving through the hands of artisans who tell their stories through their handicraft we get even closer to the culture. After exploring the village and its surroundings we will enjoy a delicious typical lunch in the palenquera way.

Important information:

- 1. In Palenque it could be warmer than in Cartagena: Wear an adequate amount of sunscreen, such as hats and sunscreen during the tour.
- 2. Carry and drink an adequate amount of water.
- 3. Ask permission before taking photos of the locals.

Day 11:Cartagena

Cartagena's City tour by bike: We offer a guided city tour by bicycle through the historical center (the walled city), Getsemani'a and Manga.

The tour starts in the historical center: We will ride by all the main attractions and landmarks and we will stop several times in order to take photos and listen to our guide's stories about Cartagena.

The tour goes on to Getsemani´, the neighborhood where Florentino Ariza lived. He's the main character in the worldwide known novel *Love in the time of Cholera* that is written by Colombian Nobel Prize winner Gabriel Garci´a Ma´rquez.

Then, we will go across the Roman Bridge, towards Manga. We will pass the beautiful Villa Roman. We will then visit the cementery of Manga, the oldest cementery in Cartagena. We continue along the seafront to finish our tour in the city center.

Subject to change. The itinerary of this tour can vary depending on the condition of the participants.

Our guide will pick you up if your hotel is located i the Historic Center or Getsemaní.
